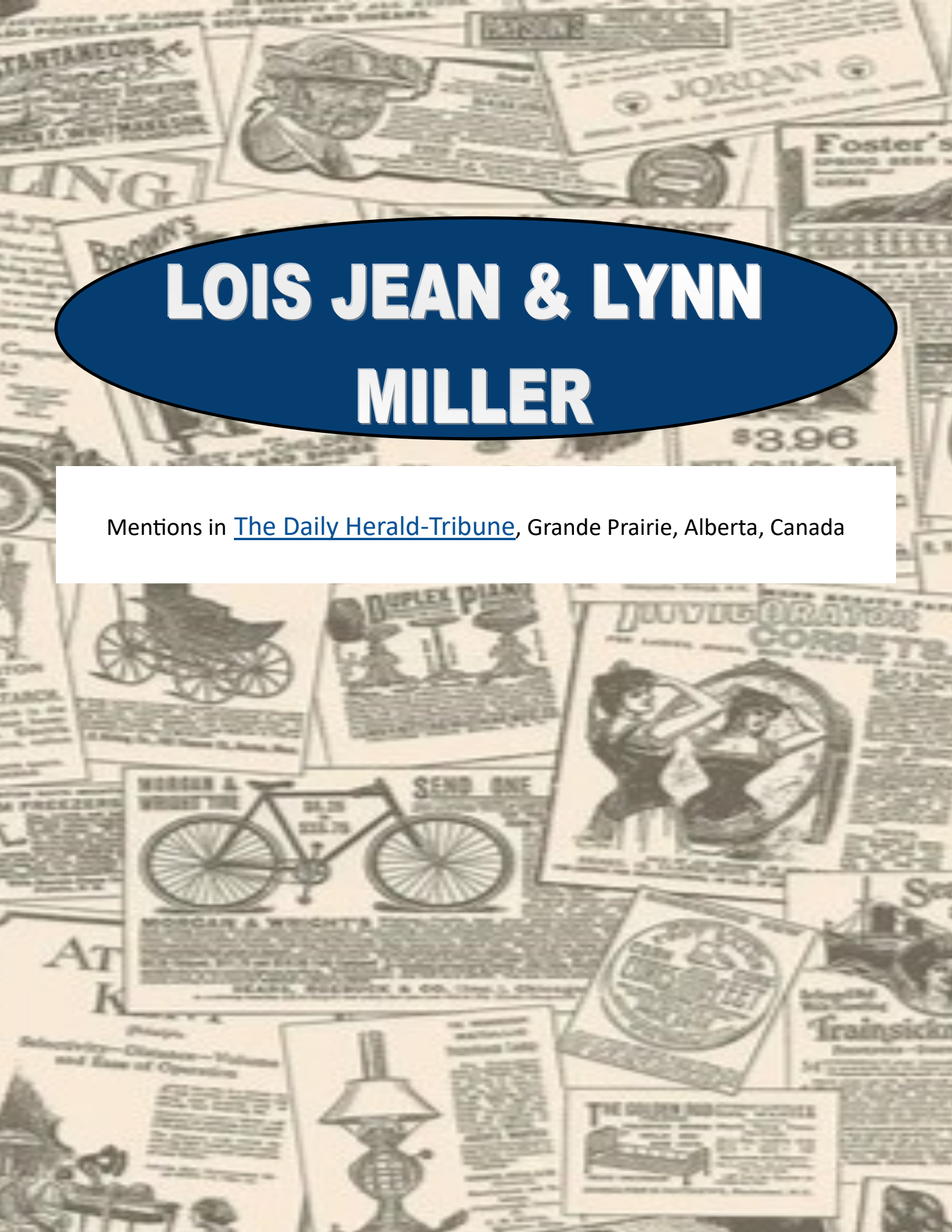

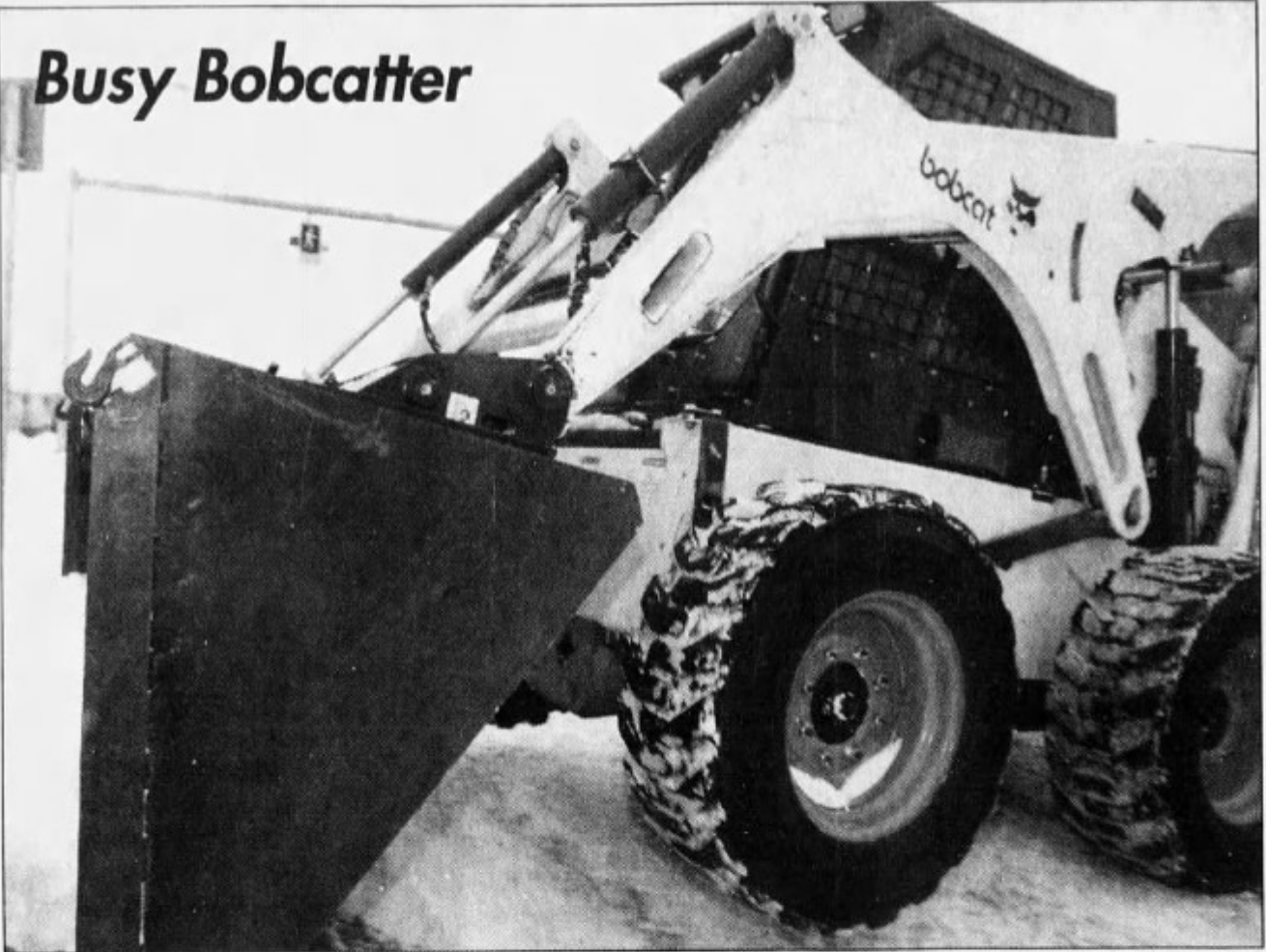
Wilma was predeceased by her parents Eileen and Stuart Scott.
